Trial procedure, sentencing and appeal. Rules relating to the use of criminal evidence including bad character, hearsay and confession evidence, and the admission or exclusion of evidence. Youth court procedure, jurisdiction, allocation and sentencing. The creation of a persuasive and coherent submission to the court, including modes of address and Court room etiquette.
