Notes

This module will introduce students to the Public Health England agenda of prevention in relation to drug and alcohol misuse. It will primarily focus on a UK perspective but with recourse to international perspectives as appropriate.

The module aims to explore how alcohol and substance misuse can be prevented at three stages: Primary Prevention, Secondary Prevention and Tertiary Prevention.

The module considers the various responses offered by education, criminal justice and substance misuse services towards prevention.
