Outline Syllabus

The module is structured around the development and presentation of one piece of performance. The module draws together the skills, knowledge and experience developed elsewhere in the programme and provides students with the opportunity to put theory into practice. Throughout the module, students will be required to keep a production casebook/logbook that both includes The Actor's Homework as well as notes that reflect upon the work undertaken throughout the pre-rehearsal, rehearsal, and performance process. This is then translated into a rigorous critical appraisal at the end of the performance run. You are expected to employ appropriate and professional codes of practice

Students will participate in the following:

- Research and Analysis of both Play and Character
- Employ and integrate acting, voice, movement, and singing (where appropriate) techniques in rehearsal and performance in order to render a fully realised character at a professional standard
- Reflect and critically analyse the rehearsal and performance process with an understanding of your development as an actor
- Incorporate appropriate and professional codes of practice
