### Aims

The module will outline the extensive role of the production manager, discussing the implications of being a member of the senior management team of a theatre with all of the related management duties. The learner will develop the required technical understanding of performance with ability to problem solve and cope well under pressure, excellent 'people skills' including good written and verbal skills and an

ability to motivate staff to work under extreme pressure. The module will highlight the importance of health and safety regulations.

# **Outline Syllabus**

Introduction to module and LIPA project - The role of the LIPA production manager Running effective production meetings, agendas and minutes. Union agreements and contracts Scheduling and finance Industry suppliers The role of the Rep Production manager The role of the touring production manager Planning and personnel Health and safety legislation and responsibilities Organisation, Planning and legal obligations

# **Learning Activities**

The module will be taught by the module leader through a series of lectures and by visiting external practitioners representing the variety of professional environments where the role is found. Each session will be followed by a discussion/seminar, allowing students to further examine the areas raised within the lecture. It will balance external professional practice and the expectations of students working within an educational environment. There will be a strong emphasis on the responsibility of the Production Manager to acquire a detailed knowledge of good

health and safety practice and ensure that this is translated into policy within their practical work, they will also be subject to a mock licensing inspection.

Assessment will be through the learner compiling a portfolio of relevant paperwork used to support their practical role as a Production Manager assigned to a LIPA show. There will also be opportunity to assess during production meetings run by the student as part of their role on practical projects, each student must prepare a meeting and chair a meeting. Students will be expected to work on practical projects outside of taught classes. Practical work will be observed and followed by the module leader via the production meetings and via tutorials held with each student whilst they are in production.

### Notes
