These will include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Writing letters and emails, CV's, and verbal communication skills. • Third Year students discussing their experiences from Level Two. • Visits from potential placement host organizations. • Health and Safety issues related to the work placement The lectures will be followed up with tutorials at points during the year as each student negotiates and secures placement activity. The student will then spend the allotted time away and write up and evaluate the experience in private study time.
