Outline Syllabus	Instrumental tuition will consist of weekly one-to-one classes. This module component is concerned with continuing to develop individual instrumental technique and proficiency, supporting the student's continued learning and knowledge of further musical styles and the associated repertoire, contributing to the student's continuing musical development, continuit to develop and nurture individual instrumental study skills and habits, and continuing to develop appropriate preparation and presentation skills. More emphasis will be given to allowing students to develop their own musical personality.
