Learning Activities

The learning and teaching strategy will be a series of formal lectures which describe the development, administration and enforcement of contemporary Planning and Building Control policy in the United Kingdom.

Access to policy, applications and associated documentation which remain extant in the public domain will feature throughout the delivery of the module. Such source material will form the basis of tutorials and group discussions to provide students with real-time experiences of potentially contentious aspects of the development control process.

Specialist guest speakers from the planning and building control professionals will be invited to contribute to the delivery.

Site visits undertaken as part of this or other associated modules will provide appropriate vehicles for aspects of Town Planning and Building Control to be considered in site-specific contexts

This module will provide students with an appreciation of the development of Town Planning in the United Kingdom, and the role of contemporary Planning Authorities in the preparation of policy and the implementation of control in respect of land use. The module also seeks to provide the student with an appropriate grounding in the work of public- and private-sector Building Inspectors in defining and enforcing the requirements of the Building Regulations.
