The dissertation module requires students to undertake a sustained piece of academic analysis and present this in a proper academic form. This allows students to achieve a thorough understanding of theoretical and methodological issues relevant to their chosen subject of study.

Students will be asked to supply a provisional topic at the end of Level II in their core course "Research Methods" which is the preparation for this module. Students must have successfully passed level 5 5027MEDCUL Research Methods in order to choose the Dissertation as a level 6 option. Students must be able to demonstrate they have the ability to carry out a sustained piece of research on an appropriate topic and it may be the case that proposals are turned down. Students must follow the 'style notes'.

Dissertations should be typed (two copies).
