Outline Syllabus

Professional practice, particularly in relation to relevant laws and their enforcement. Emergency planning, communicable and non communicable disease threats to health.

Role of the EHP as a partner. Benefits and problems associated with partnership working and how to be a good partner and work in partnership with other professionals.

The range of interventions and enforcement options available to EHPs across the range of the 5 key intervention areas.

Learning Activities

This module will be primarily student led. Interactive lectures and seminars will facilitate increased knowledge. Guided reading and the use of Canvas will guide independent study.

Notes

This module will be student led, although guided by tutors. Students will be able to sit in on a range of lectures related to their topics, but will also be required to develop their own learning plans to achieve the required outcomes.

In relation to the examination, students will be provided with 5 possible exam questions in advance of the exam. Prior to the exam itself, the module leader will select 2 questions which will be presented to the students on the day of the exam for them to answer.
