This module focuses around major project related to health and social care practice. This will offer an opportunity for an empirical study or desk-based research project in an area of interest and potential employment for the student. The module will support the student through their dissertation/project process by drawing parallels with theories and approaches to project management.

The module also carries eighty hours of placement so that the students can continue to experience working in a health and social care related setting and reflect on

employability skills. This reflection will be evidenced through completion of the World of Work Skills Gold stage, a testimonial from the placement supervisor, and a reflection examining the links between their work-based experiences and project management.
