Learning Activities

The module will be taught through a combination of lectures, group work, workshops, school-based tasks and tutorials. Sessions will focus on the trainee's developing awareness of the current issues in relation to the teaching of MFL in Key Stages 2 and 3, including the relevant theory and research which underpins it. The module will encourage participative approaches to learning. School based placements and specific directed tasks will enable students to relate the theory of learning and teaching to best practice. Assessment will be through an examination and a piece of writing that shows a critical understanding of the concepts.

This module aims to explore a range of contemporary issues central to modern languages, concentrating on the impact of Government strategies but also looking at other important issues in the field such as gender and cultural differences and meeting the needs of the individual learner.
