Outline Syllabus

A few lead lectures and seminars to set the scene. Complete a skills audit; produce a CV; develop and negotiate a learning agreement; undertake personal development techniques; consider Kolb's experiential learning cycle and apply it to placement experience; undertake and complete a WRL placement according to stated aims and objectives.

Learning Activities

This module is delivered through a series of lectures, workshops and tutorials. Students are required to complete one day a week regularly and one block of a week's work placement.

Notes

Work Related Learning placements are essential to enable theory application to be put into practice in a work situation. Furthermore they are vital to introduce future employment opportunities. Within the course progression there should be an increasing degree of responsibility and independent work. A project should be undertaken for the Agency, where possible. This module is an option.
