Outline Syllabus

Students will be offered individual supervision/tutorial support to discuss and enhance the work based or work related learning that they undertake. Students will be required to complete a range of tasks mutually agreed by their placement, where appropriate, the tutor and the student. A learning agreement will be drawn up for each student to develop a portfolio of assessment materials and monitor the progress of the work involved.

Learning Activities

Individual supervision. Group tutorials where appropriate. Working towards completion of negotiated work based or work related tasks. On-line tutor support.

This module provides students about to embark on their working lives with the opportunity to either undertake a placement or engage in work related learning. The aim is that students will be able to identify the skills and abilities that transfer from
