Outline Syllabus

A minimum of 90 hours work experience in a criminal justice agency. Supportive learning activities in the university in the form of regular seminars. The syllabus will be determined by learning agreement(s) and in the light of the aims of the work-based placement(s). The learning agreement will identify a topic for the assessed project to fullfill individual programme requirements and the project report will be presented to a seminar.

Learning Activities

Negotiate, work experience, observation and recording, analysis, evaluation, practice in key skills, and preparation of a project report on the placement.

Notes

This module is intended to provide an opportunity for work-based learning for those students who are able to arrange this for themselves. It will combine learning skills with practical experience in a criminal justice agency and an opportunity to relate theory to practice. There will be an emphasis on developing observational and evaluative skills.
