4. The final assessment for this module is 100% Dissertation (comprising a written proposal, final research content, a bibliography or list of references, a critical evaluation and associated supporting work).

5. Written feedback is given in response to an interim review.

6. On-going informal feedback will be available via tutorial and seminar.
