Authoring websites with relevant content;

Providing an educational programme for a target audience.

Learning Activities

Student will undertake EITHER the writing of a researched dissertation of 5000-6000 words OR their own in-depth programme of projects specified by a Learning Agreement. The Learning Agreement will include the headings of Project

Aims/Presentation/Evaluation and Learning Outcomes. The work submitted will include a self-evaluation report of 2,000-3000 words, supported by evidence in appendices.
