Aims

Outline Syllabus

There is no syllabus as such, due to the Independent Study programme being tailored to the needs and requirements of the individual student. Nonetheless, most Independent Studies involve the development of several substantive pieces of coursework, possibly presented together in a portfolio or submitted sequentially, and increasing in length and depth as the Independent Study progresses. The difference between an Independent Study and a Dissertation is that the former permits the production of related pieces of coursework whereas the latter must be a fully integrated single 'package'.

A Learning Agreement will be developed for each student, who will be allocated a tutor who will supervise the work, give feedback and advice and monitor the progress of the study in regular tutorial sessions. Group sessions may also be held.

Learning Activities

One to one tutorials with allocated tutor, occasional support classes eg. on webdesign.
