Aims

Outline Syllabus

The Learning Outcomes for this module will be achieved through project-based Learning Agreements. Each student will devise their own programme of work, which is supported and guided by tutorials and seminars. Students may work on one or more self-generated projects. They will be expected to work independently and demonstrate an ability to use available resources effectively. Student will undertake a sustained research project, negotiated with staff, that critically and theoretically situates the students own practice within the context of contemporary art. The Learning Agreement will include the headings of Project

Aims/Presentation/Evaluation and Learning Outcomes. The Online publication will evidence a rigorous critical and theoretical evaluation of the student's practical work to a professional and public facing standard. The final research project will be either a 7000 word dissertation or similar project.

Learning Activities

Students learn relevant skills in planning and managing their own work schedule. They will need to demonstrate these skills and techniques in both tutorials with their supervisor and the dissertation presentations that they are required to give. They will also need to show self-motivation over an extended time period. Throughout their work on the dissertation students are required to attend general, small-group and tutorial meetings, with practical sessions as appropriate, in order to present and discuss the development and progress of the dissertation.

Notes

This module enables students to undertake an in-depth critical and theoretical evaluation of their own developing practice. Via sustained application and increasing independence of operation, the module provides an opportunity for students to enhance and consolidate intellectual and practical achievements.
