Then an AV presentation over 2 days of the concept / research in week 2-3 of semester 1. 6 no seminar / lectures on subject areas. 6 no group tutorials of 6 hrs, 2 no review / feedback of 6 hrs, Scheme level; three dimensional spatial manipulation in relation to a specialist knowledge and its integration.
