Outline Syllabus

This module requires students to apply their knowledge of principles and techniques in an integrated way. Students will normally undertake tasks in conjunction with an industrial partner. They will receive an initial briefing on each task and be required to work in groups to produce some of the project deliverables within a relatively short timescale. Thereafter, students will receive guidance and feedback from industrial and academic supervisors, leading to final submission of a report. Assessment will be broken down into a number of group- and individually-related marks, depending on the nature of the assignment(s) being undertaken in a particular year.

Learning Activities

Introductory lectures followed by attachment to a particular organisation and/or project, in which students will follow a programme of independent study. Typically, students will undertake two discrete assignments, one per semester. Students will be attached to a selection of transport businesses and/or projects, where they will have the opportunity to make a meaningful, practical contribution.

This module aims to integrate the taught parts of the course by placing students, as far as possible, in a workplace environment in line with the requirements of the LJMU WoW initiative. This will be achieved through attachment to a selection of transport businesses and/or projects, giving students the opportunity to make a meaningful, practical contribution.
