Outline Syllabus

This module allows students to work in partnership with a voluntary / community organisation (VCO) to undertake a community-based learning project. Students are encouraged to take a collaborative approach in which they are working with communities, not simply for the community. Students will be expected to manage their projects independently with support from an allocated academic supervision and a link worker situated in the VCO placement. Formative feedback and guidance will be offered via tutorials and workshops.

Learning Activities

Original data collection, fieldwork, one-to-one supervision meetings, regular placement time at the VCO premises, producing drafts of the client report, ongoing communication and negotiation with VCO partner, workshops, tutorials.

This module focuses on self-directed community-based learning and affords students to undertake a piece of work in partnership with a voluntary /community organisation (VCO). The module engages with current issues and challenges facing VCOs. It offers opportunities for students to reflect on the links between their programme of study and issues facing the local community.
