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### **Outline Syllabus**

*Work-based learning; developing learning/work placement objectives; communication and collaboration within a work placement context; the ethical considerations; practical project skills; identifying and reviewing relevant literature.*

### **Learning Activities**

Students will be expected to negotiate a Criminology related work placement with a local employer/organization and to agree work placement objectives in association with the workplace provider and their academic supervisor. The module is supported by workshops and tutorials that help focus the student on identifying, overcoming and reflecting on challenges, such as negotiating work placement access and undertaking work based learning.
