Outline Syllabus

A discussion of existing literature on research methods, analysis of the differing schools of thought which have contributed towards the research process. Different paradigmatic fields, problems and limitations of the organisational research, quantitative and qualitative research, the use of different resources as a research medium.

The debate regarding choreography as a research methodology.

Learning Activities

Formal lectures dominate and serve to map out the module syllabus and indicate the level of study required. Seminar sessions enable students to clarify and discuss any aspects of the module, and in particular to their paradigmatic approach and methodology in relation to their research proposal. Tutorials enable students to discuss and consider issues relevant to their proposal.

Notes

This module will enable students to develop an understanding of the different components of the research process and how such research impacts on dance. In addition, students will be given the skill and knowledge to compile a research proposal.
