### **Aims**

existing skills and knowledge in order to provide safe, evidence-based, risk-managed, holistic nursing care to children, young people and their families within the community context. In particular this will include children with acute and short-term conditions; children with long term conditions; children with disabilities and complex conditions including those requiring continuing care and neonates and children with life-limiting illness, including those requiring palliative and end of life care.

Nurse Prescribing (V100) - Models of consultation, accurate assessment; history taking; communication and consultation with patients and their carers, concepts of working diagnosis or best formulation, development of a management plan and/or clinical management plan, confirmation of diagnosis/differential diagnosis, to prescribe or not to prescribe, non-drug treatment or referral for treatment, stopping medication prescribed by others, medicines review

#### **Notes**

This course will encourage students to combine their theoretical and practice-based learning to enable them to work towards improving the experiences of children, young people and their famies where they specific care needs across integrated pathways of services, including primary, secondary and in some cases tertiary care. They will be supported to achieve throughout this challenging learning journey through a robust partnership between academic staff, practice teachers and mentors.

This module includes community practitioner prescribing which is assessed by an exam. The pass mark is 80%, however the numeracy questions must score 100%. Additionally, if any answers suggest risking the patient's health, the exam will be marked as a fail. The prescribing competences in the V100 Practice Competency Framework Document must also be passed. The prescribing element of this module constitutes a pass/fail.
