Outline Syllabus

Improvisation, solo and small group work, ensemble work, various rehearsal techniques, rehearsal preparation, performance techniques.

Learning Activities

Students will be required to work as soloists, in small groups and as member of a large ensemble as well as contribute ideas and material within the devising process. There will be use of peer assessment and video playback for rehearsal feedback and performance analysis.
