Aims

To develop students' language, critical awareness, analytical and evaluative study skills in order for them to successfully engage with and complete a Masters level programme of study.

To develop students' English reading, writing, listening and speaking skills to an IELTS equivalent of 6.5.

To familiarise students with the academic expectations placed upon postgraduate students attending UK universities, and to introduce them to, and engage them with, the requirements of postgraduate study.

## **Learning Outcomes**

After completing the module the student should be able to:

- 1 Write well-structured academic texts using a variety of sentence structures and cohesive devices to convey precise meaning
- 2 Engage on a critical and analytical level with both written and spoken texts, and be able to evaluate them in terms of reliability, relevancy and argumentation
- 3 Use a range of language to express ideas which will be considered sufficient for postgraduate level study. This will happen with minimal hesitation (when speaking) and with a generally high degree of accuracy
- 4 Take retrievable notes from a variety of sources and prove their usefulness through summary, paraphrase and synthesis
- 5 Speak with a degree of fluency, confidence and spontaneity that would be considered acceptable for postgraduate level study, expanding and supporting ideas with subsidiary points and relevant examples
- 6 Use reflection strategies to evaluate own learning and actively engage with reflective feedback to enhance understanding and ability
- 7 Demonstrate proficiency in reading, writing, listening and speaking comparable to IELTS 6.5
