## **Outline Syllabus**

The syllabus will be flexible year on year according to the repertoire selected for Level Three Performance projects but will aim to support individuals and companies in the detailed development of their work vocally and physically.

This may be delivered through group workshop, seminar or individual tutorials.

In addition a weekly 'clinic' will allow students to explore and present audition portfolio material and receive technical skills input for further development..

Upon completion of performance project work the student will have a final individual assessment tutorial in which the student is expected to orally review the vocal and physical challenges of the work during the year and set themselves targets for continued development of vocal and physical technique upon completion of the course.
