Bowel cancer and polyps: epidemiology. aetiology, pathology, investigations, diagnosis, treatments and outcomes. The NHS Cancer Plan, The National Bowel Cancer Screening Programme: its development, implementation management and

evaluation strategies. NIHCE / BSG guidelines. An overview of other gastro-intestinal disorders that may influence presentation and endoscopy findings. Other medical, psychological and social problems that may influence the diagnostic and treatment pathway.
