Manual handling, CPR, central lines/PICC line management, Advanced COPD and spirometry, sepsis, blood gases, Oxygen saturations IV devices, assessment of deteriorating patient, ABCDE assessment reviewed, DKA and HONK, advanced respiratory assessment. 3 lead ECG's, cardiac A/P revisited. Tracheostomy care. Psychological care of the acutely unwell patient. Care of the dying patient.
