Outline Syllabus

The Professional Practice and Reflection module offers you the opportunity to build upon the information and knowledge gleaned from the Photographic Practice module at level two of the programme. In this module you are required to demonstrate that you are capable of working effectively as an independent photographer within a professional context, as well as being a responsible and valued member of a team. To this end, you must initiate a consultation with an appropriate established professional (curator, editor, publisher, practitioner, etc), who will offer feedback on your portfolio, upon which you must then reflect. Furthermore, you should demonstrate an ability to evaluate your own practice via a review of your final project – its evolution from start to finish- with a view to identifying a career path/s relevant to your intended goals and future aspirations. The module will require you to draw upon your skills to effectively interact and collaborate with others.

Learning Activities

Seminars which explore potential careers paths in photography; working independently and with others towards a collective exhibition; Taught sessions on marketing and promoting oneself as a professional photographer with skills to offer. Career awareness through peer presentations. Module will culminate in a PowerPoint presentation and written report.
