Aims

To provide students with the opportunity carry out an extended analysis of relevant printed literature and electronic sources of information/secondary data into a topic of their own choosing.

To provide students with an opportunity to produce an in-depth analysis of the

findings drawn from relevant literature and electronic research sources.

Learning Outcomes

Outline Syllabus

For most of this module, students will work independently and be expected to use the research skills and concepts introduced in years one and two to conduct their own research. Supplementary research methods training relating to the research process, conduct; analysis and presentation of research findings expected within a dissertation will be provided during the learning activities outlined above.

Learning Activities

A mixture of research lectures, small group supervision sessions, peer review sessions, student led seminars and self-directed learning.

Students will also be expected to have a minimum of 10 hours one-to-one supervision tutorial with their dissertation supervisor. It is the student's responsibility to request these sessions as required during the course of this module

Notes

The dissertation provides students with the opportunity to carry out a substantive

piece of research over two semesters that draws on a variety of relevant literature, electronic sources and other sources of secondary data relating to a topic of their own choosing drawn from the social sciences and/or health studies. This choice is made in negotiation with subject tutors. The module allows students to conduct an extended piece of research to provide an in depth analysis and evaluation of a range of relevant material relating to their chosen topic. Regular supervision tutorials provide opportunities for informal formative assessment techniques to support student learning as well as to discuss overall progress of the work during its preparation.
