## **Outline Syllabus**

This module will focus on one self initiated assignment over an extended period of time. The completed practical work will form the focus of the end of year Degree Show exhibition and will offer the student an opportunity to show case their area of specialism.

Students will be required to complete a learner contract prior to initiating the production of any practical work. They will be encouraged to attend bi-weekly academic tutorials in order to offer both feedback and direction.
