Project proposals, as agreed via a learning contract, will be approved subject to

Module Content

Outline Syllabus	This module allows the student to develop to a professional level as a songwriter and to identify and establish songwriting activities and projects focussed on a potential career. A mix of seminars, tutorials, lectures and workshops are employed throughout the course, however, the emphasis is firmly on self-directed learning as agreed through Learning Contracts and as set out in approved project plans and proposals. Students are required to apply knowledge and skills developed in songwriting modules at levels 1 & 2 but are also required to draw upon knowledge, skills and experiences developed in levels 1& 2 business, contextual and professional modules together with the practical experience gained from levels 1&2 practical and performance projects. Whilst songwriting led, projects may draw upon and feature elements from the performance and production modules.
