Aims	Academic English and Research Skills aims to provide thorough training in the language and related academic skills which will enable students to best achieve their academic potential at University. The main aims for this module are: 1. To develop awareness and competency in the range of language-related skills required for successful study at Higher Education level. These include the processes and conventions of academic writing, effective and extensive reading strategies, effective participation in seminars and delivery of presentations, and listening to and recording information effectively from lectures. 2. To develop the accuracy and range of written and spoken language to enable students to use language effectively and appropriately, with clarity and confidence. 3. To support in reflecting on your learning and identifying how to improve skills and language. 4. To ensure students are able to meet the requirements of the UKVI and the partner University through demonstrating an English language level of CEFR B2 in the skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking.
