Outline Syllabus

Students will be introduced to the institution, its location and its research resources. Through lectures, seminars and writing workshops students will be introduced to Qualitative Research Methodologies, Action research and models of practitioner enquiry research in the visual arts. Students will develop a research proposal and undertake an investigation in an appropriate area of their practice. Students will select and emp; loy relevant research methods and data analysis tools introduced within the module and critically reflect upon the reseach process and findings in relation to their professional development. Peer review will support the development of a research community and critical friending neccessary to the reflexive process. Tutorial support will help students to negotiate an appropriate research focus and guide individual investigations.
