Outline Syllabus	Learning StrategyA short series of introductory lectures covers the base of research methodologies and resources available, focused on the point of view of the creative popular theatre/performance artist, and will explore the usefulness of different research methods in analysing and developing our understanding of popular theatres/performance in general. Subsequently, students will go on to develop an individual proposal for research that is both genre and discipline specific related to their personal practice, demonstrating their understanding and ability to use appropriate research methods in structuring their work. This may be related to the later Dissertation and Project module, but is not a requirement.
