### **Outline Syllabus**

The module will be taught in seminars, group and individual tutorials, with practical sessions and field visits as appropriate. Lectures and seminars will offer support in the following:

- Undertaking ethical research
- · Research project planning and management
- What to expect from supervision
- Undertaking and analysing empirical work
- Organising, structuring and writing your research report

Students will define individual aims and objectives through tutorial guidance. Typically tutorials will focus upon:

- Advanced research methods, including, where appropriate, archival research.
- Advanced Literature Searching
- Formulating a methodology in the specific subject context.
- File Management.
- Presentation of thesis and practice.
- How to perform successfully/confidently in a viva voce.
- Structuring an M level research project
- Setting parameters for research.
- Defining a theoretical framework.
- Offering guidance and support on the research.

It also provides an opportunity for building on advanced skills in research and scholarship assessed at Certificate and Diploma modules, students will undertake a programme of research, design, critique and revision of their proposed area of study.
