Outline Syllabus

There is no specific syllabus: however, the following items should be addressed during the programme of study:

Selection of project and rationale for choice: identification of project objectives and programme, planning and scheduling of project tasks, relationship with previous research in subject area.

Project progress: Adherence to schedule liaison with nominated supervisor.

Presentation: Preparation and submission of a bound dissertation of approximately 15,000 words.

Learning Activities

Preparation of a project proposal, literature search, independent investigative activities in pursuit of the project aims, compilation of the written project.

Notes

This module accounts for 60 credits out of a full MSc programme of 180 credits. A substantial dissertation is written and submitted for examination.
