Notes

This module provides participants with the opportunity to apply a range of teaching, learning and assessment strategies and technologies in order to meet the NMC stage 4 standards. It aims to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding of HE level nurse and midwifery educators in practice and academic settings. The module draws upon theoretical knowledge of teaching and learning, and upon best academic practice, and asks participants to apply this underpinning to nursing or midwifery education.

All participants will be required to show evidence of a minimum of 360 hours teaching and assessment practice in academic and practice settings. This will enable them (upon completion of the full PG Cert LTHE) to be eligible for entry onto the NMC teacher register.
