## **Outline Syllabus**

Historical perspectives on tobacco and health. Evidence for the links between active smoking, secondhand smoke and health. Political, economic and commercial influences on tobacco use. The role of governmental and non governmental organisations e.g. ASH and FOREST. Tobacco advocacy, lobbying and social marketing. Current UK and EU policy on tobacco and environmental tobacco smoke. Development and evaluation of tobacco control programmes such as brief interventions, media campaigns, legislation, cessation support services etc.

## **Learning Activities**

The module will be delivered online via Blackboard using a variety of study aids. Guided reading materials, online PowerPoint presentations, podcasts and interactive exercises/quizzes will be used to guide learners through the subject areas. Weekly discussion boards/blogs focusing on a question posed by the tutor will promote discussion and sharing of ideas and knowledge, between students, as well as between students and the tutor. Students will be encouraged to read widely and to keep abreast of current trends and issues by reference to online resources such as research articles, government reports and websites, and lobby group websites.
