The EPA is delivered by the University in preparation for the final award of Masters degree in Advanced Clinical Practice.

During this process the apprentice will be supported in a variety of ways through individual and group tutorials and by means of VLE. The assessment is standardised and set by the apprenticeship standard for Advanced Clinical Practice. The EPA will be completed in a maximum three month period following successful transition through the EPA gateway. The three month period includes the time needed for the

apprentice to prepare and undertake the EPA but does not include the period required to conclude subsequent academic confirmation of results and award processes. Assessments will be graded by an appointed external assessor and moderated by an internal assessor not connected to the programme.
