# **Outline Syllabus**

Students will explore a range of topic content that will include, but not be limited to the following:

The contested nature of childhoods, and education and care.

International theories and concepts underpinning comparative education studies (for example post-colonial theory, policy borrowing, ethnocentrism)

Contemporary global issues and global agendas impacting on childhoods and children's education and care for example; movement of people, conflict and peace building, health and well-being, the Sustainable Development Goals

Culture, Context and Diversity: indigenous and colonial influences on early childhood education

Critical pedagogy and practice in a diverse range of socio-cultural and political contexts.

International institutions supporting early childhood International research agendas on early childhood education and care

### **Learning Activities**

The workshops will aim to promote discussion, analysis and provide a critical overview of policy and research on issues affecting children and their families globally.

Students will take responsibility for identifying and reviewing key literature on policy, practice to present and discuss with the group. Formative sessions will allow students and tutors to engage in a peer review of proposed focus for their case study.
