# **Outline Syllabus**

Individually negotiated between supervisor and student. Small group tutorials will deal with emerging issues related to methology, data analysis and relationship to professional practice.

# **Learning Activities**

The module will involve the student in largely self directed study to meet the outcomes. Students will be allocated a supervisor who will provide tutorial support to help the student to formulate, develop and present an appropriate dissertation in an area relevant to social work practice. Tutorial support will be provided via a series of personal and small group tutorials to discuss the progress of their work and to consider emerging issues related to methodology, data analysis and relation to social work practice

#### Notes

The dissertation permits students to engage in a major project of their choice. It encourages students to draw on research and research methodologies to locate, review and evaluate research findings relevant to health studies, and to contribute to the understanding of a specific issue through their individual study.
