Aims

- 2) To confirm and foster an original and creative voice as writer through sustained attention on the students' own work and that of their workshop peers.
- 3) To exercise a practical and analytical knowledge of writerly through self and peer appraisal.
- 4) To prepare students for individual work on their portfolio.

Learning Outcomes

After completing the module the student should be able to:

- Fairly evaluate in workshops and in commentaries the writing of their peers, and know how to justify those evaluations in depth, and with reference to contemporary writing and theory.
- 2 Edit and present their work to a professional standard.
- 3 Plan their portfolio, be cognisant of their aims and organise a schedule of work.
- Further develop and deepen work through advanced analysis and redrafting, demonstrating self-direction and originality in tackling and solving problems.

Learning Outcomes of Assessments

Outline Syllabus

- 1. For the first half of the semester, students will consider tabled work in groups of 8 or fewer. Although they will continue to generate new writing, the emphasis will be in part on the process of appraising and editing, and the preparation of work to a professional standard, and preparing for the portfolio.
- 2. Sessions will involve regular discussions of the reasons for peer appraisal, its relation to self-appraisal, and the generic grade criteria.
- 3. During the first half of the semester students will submit at least one piece of work for workshop discussion in groups of eight. The submission will be 50% peer appraisal.
- 4. Workshops will end at the mid-semester break and each student will be allocated a supervisor to advise on the preparation and writing of the final portfolio. During the second half of the semester students will write a 2,500 -word critique of a peer's workshop submission.

Learning Activities

Aims and outcomes are realised through lectures, workshops, tutorials, library visits, the residences and visits from established writers and producers and expert tutors; wider reading and the habit of writing regularly and independently.
