### **Outline Syllabus**

This module will equip students with a strong sociological underpinning of the development and the evolution of events in an international context. It will explore the shift from events as rituals and spontaneous festivities through to the planned events driven by cultural and political shifts. Typical sessions will be: Ritual and festivity; community and social structure; social and cultural capital; modernity and postmodernity; power, class and inequality; society of the spectacle; commodification; political paradigms and globalisation.
