Outline Syllabus

In developing skills, students will work in small groups. Either they will make videotapes together, taking the roles of counsellor and supervisor, or they will bring audiotapes made with their actual supervisees. In both cases, peer and tutor feedback will be used to further the student's competence.

The tutor will identify learning needs through watching/listening to tapes and engaging in discussion. Each student will present one of their tapes for formative assessment.

Learning Activities

The main learning methods for this module will be:

Tutor-led small groups which will provide regular opportunities for discussion of practice issues brought by members and will also hear and assess practice tapes.

Independent study and scholarly investigation of matters relating to the supervision practice of the student, supported by an individual tutor.

Supervision of the student's own supervision, by an individual chosen by the student and acceptable to the module leader.
