Outline Syllabus

Sustain a personal visual arts education enquiry within an appropriate context as an artist/educator that facilitates an active engagement in contemporary practices in relation to an identified conceptual theme/focus.

Introduction to critical theory and visual methodologies within the context of artsbased educational practice.

Engage in theoretical debates in relation to critical theory, eduational idealogies and contemporary art practices.

Critically reflect upon a location/community specific engagement as an artist/educator and reflect upon the implcations for developing professional practice. Present a visual display (exhibition) that documents and reflects upon the location/community specific engagement.

Learning Activities

Learning activities will include lectures by university tutors and visiting speakers, group discussions and workshop activities with tutors and visiting artists, use of ICT such as Blackboard and other resources, visual methodologies (critical theory and reflective practitioner research in particular) in relation to an appropriate intervention within the context of the student's professional practical. Individual tutorials, directed readings and focused work-based practice with underpin the student's development.

Notes

This is a practice-based module underpinned by theory through a small scale research project. Students will be expected to document a planned intervention in the context of their professional work environment with due consideration to ethical issues and protocol. Workshops and lectures will introduce and model practitioner enquiry methodology and critical theory in relation to practice. A case study appropriate to specific artists, art practices, and pedagogy will inform students' thinking. Seminar sessions will facilitate personal reflection, peer review and formative evaluation. Independent enquiry will include reading, undertaking a small scale research project, gathering and analysing empirical data that will be presented within a visual display in an appropriate location (such as the art studio at I M Marsh or the Studio at tate Liverpool).
