## Aims

- 1. To convey an understanding of the roots of science and the role of participatory science in contemporary research.
- 2. To enable an indepth understanding of the relations between methods typically employed in investigating the transpersonal and methods of psychological research more generally.
- 3. To examine key epistemological issues in transpersonal research, including the

role of subjectivity, relative strengths of first-person and third-person approaches, and the role of transformational methods.

4. To encourage preliminary work (e.g., pilot study) towards the research thesis (module PSYCDM005)

### **Outline Syllabus**

First-person and third-person methods in consciousness studies and transpersonal psychology; the rise of participatory science; historical and epistemological issues; influence of postmodernism; pluralistic approaches.

Overview of CTP methods: quantitative—experimental, questionnaire and survey designs; qualitative—phenomenology, heuristic research, grounded theory, participatory research; hermeneutic research, discourse and narrative analysis; transformational methods.

Examples of integral science: neurophenomenology, neuropsychoanalysis, neurotheology.

Approaches to coding in qualitative research; use of Computer Assisted Qualitative Data Analysis Software (CAQDAS).

### **Learning Activities**

Content is delivered via synopses of key issues presented on Blackboard, together with suggested readings available either through purchase or via online access (journals and web sites). These issues will be further explored through (unassessed) online discussion forums. In their preliminary consideration of published research papers (preparation for assessment 1), students will be encouraged to collaborate with fellow students via their own e-mail systems or via Blackboard forums (optional).

The collaborative project (assessment 2) will require collaboration in production of a semi-structured interview protocol and in the analysis of transcripts.
