## Aims and Outcomes

Aims	Every investigator requires an in-depth knowledge of the role that intelligence plays in the investigation process. Intelligence is a vital component of law enforcement activity, particularly as it underpins all investigations, allowing the investigator's hypotheses to be tested, working within the governing legislation to utilise intelligence gathering methods, theories and analytical techniques to assist in subject identification, including victims, witnesses and suspects. This module aims to raise the students' awareness of how intelligence-led policing and law enforcement activity assists the investigation process. The sessions will take the student through a structured, methodical process within an intelligence-led law enforcement environment, critically examining the principles of intelligence and the resulting analysis that supports crime investigations, considering how the investigator will implement and develop an intelligence-led approach to support the overarching investigation strategy. The module will also examine some of the wider strategic issues managed by the investigator along with the role of partner agencies when providing intelligence to support an investigation.
