## Aims and Outcomes

<b>Aims</b>	<p>Cognition, or thinking, is recognized as being a key component underlying the way people think and behave. As such, the overall aim and distinctive quality of the module is to critically explore why offenders commit acts of sexual and physical violence. This course will examine influential theories that have been developed to aid in investigating sexual/ violent offenses. Further, this module aims to explore the investigative niche area of serial offending and why offenders chose certain victims.</p> <p>Aims:1. To introduce students to a core of foundational concepts in respect to sexual and violent offences.2. To critically analyse and evaluate the central issues surrounding the interaction between offenders and victims, with an emphasis on the motivations for sexual, violent, and serial offenses</p>
